



- 1936-37** Portable rope tow operations by J.C. Blickensderfer.
- 1937-38** Operations at Loveland ski Tow Company begin
Operations taken over by Al Bennett with a rope tow that was powered by a Model T engine.
- 1939-40** The addition of 2 rope tows "A Tow" and "Rainbow Tow" (both rope tows) added.
Named Loveland Ski Tow Inc. "D Tow" and cleat track tractor added. The cleat track tractor hauled people to "D Tow" and was the only alternative to hiking up.
- 1941-42** "A Tow" replaced with new rope tow. "B Tow" (rope tow) added.
- 1946-47** "C Tow" (rope tow) added. Filled gap between the top of "B Tow" and bottom of "D Tow".
- 1948-49** September 30, 1951 Loveland's earliest opening for the season.
Stockholders purchase Loveland Ski Tow Inc. Peter Seibert named General Manager. Partners: C.A. Upham, Al Bennett, Robert Murri, Bill Bolin, Pricilla Barnard.
- 1951-52** Chair 1 (double chair) was added.
- 1955-56** Chair 2 (double) was added. Ray Parker was named the new General Manager.
- 1956-57** "Mambo Cafe" opens (near bottom of current Chair 4).
"Fury Creek" lost as construction of Dwight D. Eisenhower Memorial Tunnel begins
- 1957-58** Gorden Wren named new General Manager.
- 1958-59** Loveland Valley is built. A separate ski area for beginner and ski school.
- 1959-60** Otto Werlin named new General Manager.
- 1961-1962** First major ski area in Colorado so have snowmaking capabilities utilizing diesel compressors from the construction of the Eisenhower Tunnel
- 1965-66** Loveland Valley gets snowmaking capabilities.
- 1967-68** Chair 2 was replaced with a high capacity triple lift.

- 1989-90** Loveland Valley base area gets facelift with new building.
- 1990-91** Chair 8 (fixed grip quad) opens accessing "Zip Basin". Named after Zipfelberger Ski Club who regularly hiked to the area for skiing in the 30's.
- 1992-93** Ken Abrahamson is named General Manager.
- 1995-96** Loveland Basins main day lodge is remodeled and expanded.
Yearly record snowfall hit the area with 586 inches throughout the season.
- 1996-97** Chair 3 is replaced with a fixed grip quad lift, and the Rathskeller Bar was renovated.
- 1998-99** Chair 9 is installed providing long awaited lift access to The Ridge. Reaching an altitude of 12,700 feet, Chair # 9 is the highest chair Lift in the world.
- 2002-03** Loveland ski area broke its 24-hour snowfall record 3 times during the March Blizzard. The final record for 24-hour snowfall was finally set from Tuesday at 1pm to Wednesday 1pm when Loveland received 36 inches of fresh powder.
